

# TV TALK

More and more, we are seeing that technology is affecting our industry and its job opportunities. We are being affected by ESPN's Remi and The Big Ten Networks' Mic'r format as well as in house control rooms as the ACC Network is using for broadcasts. There are several reason, two of which pertain to cost, why these are happening and will continue to increase in numbers. First, the cost of renting a production truck with all of its equipment and moving it around the country. And second, the cost of hiring a local crew lessens substantially, when there is a crew at a control room hub that can work multiple games in a day.

The question now is, how do we deal with these changes? We must embrace the technology and take a proactive approach in gaining a voice in these new workplaces. I don't see this affecting top tier events such as the Super Bowl, the US Open, or the World Series etc. at any time in the near future. However it has changed coverage for college sports and potentially some of the smaller professional sports. This change reduces the need for the positions that are traditionally within the truck. However, in some cases, this could actually mean additional work opportunities for those positions outside of the truck, because college conference networks are broadcasting "Olympic-style" sports as part of their coverage of their "brand". Traditionally, there has been very little of the "Olympic-style" work because they are rarely broadcast, or if they are, then they are produced outside of a union contract. As this becomes more and more prevalent, new employers that are not a signatory to one of our contracts will begin to hire non-union workers. As this happens, we will lose our voice in the workplace. What does losing your voice mean? It means that the employer sets all of the work conditions as they see fit, and can change them at any time. It could mean the loss of guaranteed minimum wage rates for each position, the loss of a guaranteed minimum of hours paid in a day, loss of daily overtime, loss of meal penalties and the loss of fringe benefits like the Flex Plan and the Flex 401k. What is also frightening is that one person gets some of these guarantees and the person working next to them may not. That person may never know that they are doing the same job and getting paid less. This is completely unfair.

So how do we combat this trend? The answer has been and will always be organizing. Organizing is getting the workers at a workplace to say that they want to collectively bargain for work conditions, fair pay and fringe benefits. To do this, I need information about employers and their workers. Then, along with the union's organizing department, we can begin a strategy to help the workers get the voice that they deserve. This may also make more work opportunities so that our members can make a decent living as a freelancer in the broadcast industry.
